CNI Housing Update

The Newport News Redevelopment and Housing Authority (NNRHA) has continued to work hard on the housing portion of the CNI process. While many businesses have modified operations or temporarily closed due to the coronavirus crisis, NNRHA staff has been able to continue to plan since they are in the financing and final engineering phases for housing. If the coronavirus crisis extends into the late summer, program delays may result. Staff is in close discussions with HUD and funders on the program's status.

In preparation for Phase 2 development on the Ridlev site. 40 of the 60 families north of 16th Street have been issued Section 8 Vouchers. Due to the coronavirus, the Authority is not allowed to hold meetings for 10 or more people, so the Voucher Issuance Briefing to provide Section 8 vouchers to the last 20 residents in this area will be done individually starting the

week of April 6th. To date, 12 families have moved and 28 are looking for replacement apartments.

The April 21st Citizen Advisory Committee meeting will be changed to a conference call. Information will be shared on this meeting soon.

Low Income Tax Credit Program - Housing

The NNRHA's application for the competitive Low Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) program was submitted on March 12th. This application is for the 43-unit building, located north of 28th Street on Jefferson Avenue, being developed as a part of Phase 1 of the CNI Housing Plan. Determinations for funding awards will be made by the Virginia Housing Development Authority in late May or early June.

The NNRHA has been advised that the non-competitive application for LIHTCs for the 38-unit building, which is also a part of Phase 1 and located south of 28th Street on Jefferson Avenue, has been approved. The coronavirus crisis has caused the Federal Home Loan Bank to move their application

deadline from April to June, so the official approval has not been received. The Authority's applications for a total of \$1,000,000 are poised to be submitted.
