Housing Progress in the Marshall-Ridley Choice Neighborhood

Development plans for the first phase of the new housing in the Marshall-Ridley Choice Neighborhood are under review by the Newport News Planning Department. Plans include two multi-family buildings located on Jefferson Avenue between 27th and 29th Streets. Construction will begin in early 2021, with a projected completion date of May 2022. A contest to name the new buildings will be held in January 2021. More details about the contest will be available soon.

Planning is also underway for the second phase of new development, which will occur on the Ridley Place site. The Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC), City of Newport News and Newport News Redevelopment and Housing Authority are working with the design team to develop a final concept plan for Ridley Place.

Housing Finance

The financing package for construction of Phase One is nearly complete. The package includes low-income housing tax credits, state grants, and city funds. In December 2020, additional funding was requested from the Virginia Department of Housing & Community Development.

Relocation

In preparation for new development on the Ridley site, residents are relocating to new housing through a phased system. A total of 217 vouchers have been issued to families. As of January 4, 2021, 156 families have secured new permanent housing.

Phase 1: Fifty-eight families living north of 16th Street and families relocating early due to medical issues have found new housing. Three families continue to look for housing.

Phase 2: Seventy-six families south of 16th Street have found new housing. Twenty-two are in the process of leasing or looking for new housing.

Phase 3: Twenty-two families living in the area bounded by Ivy Avenue, 16th Street and Ridley Circle have found new housing and thirty-seven are in the process of leasing or looking for housing.

The remaining vouchers have been awarded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and will be issued over the coming weeks.
