The Lift and Connect EnVision Center: A One-Stop Resource Center

The Lift and Connect EnVision Center (LCEC) has evolved into a one-stop resource for Ridley Place residents. Residents seeking information, resources and assistance with their transition have easy access to family, financial, and workforce specialists through coordinated on-site programs, phone calls, individual coaching, and other customized services. CNI Program Navigator Anita Abrams is the single point of contact for the center, coordinating and helping with daily activities, resident contact, and support services. With a focus on customer service and responsiveness, Ms. Abrams works closely with staff and the Ridley Tenant Council to ensure LCEC activities and programs are aligned with resident needs and interests.

HRCAP continues to provide food to Ridley Place families after the partnership with the World Central Kitchen ended in early July. Fresh produce is provided to Ridley residents each week thanks to a partnership with Mercy Drops Dream Center.

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Progress and Updates

Housing Housing development activities are moving forward

The Newport News Redevelopment and Housing Authority (NNRHA) continues with housing development activities. Phase 1 includes two multifamily buildings located on Jefferson Avenue between 27th and 29th Streets. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in late 2020.

Planning for Phase 2 development of the Ridley Place site has begun. Two design workshops will be held this fall to give residents an opportunity to ask questions and participate in discussions about the new housing. The first is on September 19, 2020. See p. 2 for details.



Relocation

In preparation for new development on the Ridley site, current residents are relocating to new apartments. Vouchers are provided to families who will relocate in several groups. Here is the status of the relocation:

- Group 1: Nearly all 60 families living north of 16th Street, as well as families requesting early relocation due to medical issues, have found new housing.
- Group 2: 88 vouchers have been issued, so far, to families living south of 16th Street. 27 families have leased new apartments; 13 are in the process of leasing; 16 families have used their vouchers to leave the area and 32 are searching for new housing.
- Group 3: Vouchers will be distributed in fall 2020 to families living in the area bounded by Ivy Avenue, 16th Street and Ridley Circle.

NNRHA continues to secure funds for the new housing. NNRHA has received two low-income housing tax credit awards, a grant from the state Vibrant Community Initiatives program and pre-development funds from Virginia Housing. Three applications for Federal Home Loan Bank funding are pending.
